# LEARN A B C. Activity Guide

#### **ACTIVITIES**

#### A. With 28 Puzzle Pieces:

- 1. To teach your child the alphabet, begin with the letter "A". Point to the "Aa" at the top of the piece, say the letter aloud, then ask your child to repeat it. Next, point to the picture and read the word beneath it, saying, for instance, "apple begins with the letter "Aa". Continue in this way with all the cards.
- 2. Help the child to join the pieces in alphabetical order.
- 3. Once the child is able to recognize the letters of the alphabet and their sequence ask hither to assemble the puzzle with the help of the picture printed on the front of the box.

## B. With Flash Cards:

- 1. Spread out the letter and picture cards on a table or floor. Introduce the letters and sounds of the alphabet by talking about the letters and pictures at random.
- 2. Ask the child to pick out a particular letter/picture card from a pile and say, Can you think of other things that begin with this letter?
- 3. Ask the child to match the pictures/letters with their corresponding letters/pictures.

## **MEMORY GAME**

Mix all the letter and picture cards well. Lay all the cards face down in rows. The first player turns over 2 cards. if the letter and picture cards match, the player keeps them and continues choosing. If they do not match, then it's the next player's turn. Keep playing until all the cards are matched. The players have the added choice of pairing their cards with the cards that have already been. revealed. You can ask your child to play by himself/herself and try to match the cards as quickly as possible.

## **SEQUENCING**

Choose a sequence of 5 to 6 letters from the alphabet cards and name them together as you lay them down. Ask your child to close or cover his/her eyes. Remove a card and ask your child to uncover his/her eyes and identify the missing letter. Go on doing this activity with other sets of cards.

Choose a sequence of 4 to 5 letter cards and lay them on a table. Ask your child to name letter that precedes or follow the group.

Ask the child to arrange the letters of alphabet in proper order.
